#### Sacraments for 2020:

Our Year 6 children are preparing to receive the Sacrament of Confirmation. Bishop Terry came out this week to visit the children and he talked about the importance of having a sponsor and the role that they have in the life of the Confirmation Candidate. Bishop Terry talked about the commitment that the children make, their chosen Saint's name and much more. Following the visit with Year 6, Bishop Terry joined the staff for morning tea. As always, it was lovely to see him in the lead up to our Confirmation.

#### **Parish and School Connections:**

Our timetable for Thursday and Saturday masses is now complete. Each class will attend two Thursday masses at 9.15am and two Saturday masses at 6pm throughout the year. This year we will have two classes at each of these masses. This Thursday the 20th of February will be for Year 4M and 4W. On Thursday the 27th of February we will have mass with Year 5G and 5B. These are Parish masses and families are also invited to attend.

Our first Saturday Family mass for the year will be held on Saturday the 29th of February at 6pm. This will be the first of the two options for Year 6 families to attend in preparation for Confirmation. This is a Rite of Acceptance mass and the children will need to bring their completed red scroll with them. For children who cannot make that mass, there is a second option on Saturday the 7th of March.

#### **Ash Wednesday:**

On Wednesday the 26th of February, the Year 1-6 classes will attend a Parish/School Mass in the church at 9.15am. At this mass we will have ashes distributed to celebrate Ash Wednesday. In addition to this, our school staff will be commissioned. Our School Captains will collect some ashes to distribute with the prep children upon their return on the Thursday. The Captains from St Augustine's will collect ashes which will be provided for their school community as well. We welcome the opportunity to share this celebration with our friends at St Augustine's.

#### Term 1 Week 4 SWB @ STC

Dear Parents and Carers,

Welcome back to St Christopher's, 2020 (it's still strange typing that!). It promises to be another fantastic and exciting year at our school. I hope that you all had a wonderful break with your families that was relaxing and refreshing.

My family had a terrific break, my wife is still on maternity leave so having that 6 weeks together as a family was a precious and wonderful time for us all. We got to beautiful Noosa for a week in the middle of January and enjoyed the heat, beaches and rainforests of the Sunshine Coast. Our son Hendrix has started kinder, so I'm feeling for all of the new prep parents this year! And our daughter Zadie has started child care in preparation for my wife returning to work next month, family life is busy, isn't it?

Our students have had a great start to the new school year. Adrian and I got around to all of the grades from years 2—6 and had a discussion about our school rules and procedures that we have in place to keep all of our students feeling happy, safe and ready to learn at STC. I'd like to draw your attention to a couple that we highlighted with our students:

#### Show respect at all times through our actions and words

We highlighted this rule to ensure that students were mindful of their interactions with each other and their teachers. We used the words **escalation** and **de-escalation** as a way to describe how our choices in communication could help or hinder the conflict resolution process when an issue arose.

#### Do not fight or intentionally physically harm others

We reworded this rule from its origin of "Do not use hands, feet, or objects to solve problems". We take very seriously the issue of physical violence at St Christopher's and will be responding strongly to it with tougher automatic consequences of an afterschool detention if students fight or intentionally physically hurt each other.

Please have a conversation with your children about what they got out of mine and Adrian's conversations with the grades. Your help in ensuring our students have the best possible learning environment at St Christopher's is very much appreciated.

#### **Peaceful Kids:**

Our 2020 Peaceful Kids will be offered for years 5 and 6 (1 group), 3 and 4 (1 group) and potentially year 2 (1group) and will begin towards the end of term 1. We already have a number of students locked in for this round but if you wish to have your child participate, send me through an email and I will work out if we can fit them in for this round, otherwise, I will add them to the waiting list for round 2 (being offered term 2/3). You will receive a hard copy of a permission form if your child is to participate in the program for the round 1 2020 PK offering.

#### **Early pickups:**

Please keep any early pickups and late arrivals to a minimum, an uninterrupted school day gives our students the best opportunity to learn and thrive. On the occasion that this does occur please endeavour to avoid early pickups and late arrivals during the school's break periods:

#### **CURRICULUM NEWS**

#### **English Target Teaching:**

Our Target Teaching English support programs will begin in Week 5 this term. This year, we will be offering the following programs:

- Reading Recovery—Year 1
- Levelled Literacy Intervention (LLI)—Years 1-5
- Group Reading, Rereading Easy Text Aloud Daily (GRREAD)—Years 1—2 and Prep in Semester 2
- Reading Target Teaching—Years 3 & 5
- Writing Target Teaching—Years 4 & 6

If your child has been selected to participate in a formal program such as Reading Recovery, LLI or GRREAD, you will receive a letter outlining the program and will need to sign that you have received notification. Reading and Writing Target Teaching groups are more informal and form part of our everyday practice. Children will move in and out of these support groups as needed and no formal notification is required for this support. Students are selected for support based on school data and assessments. This data will also direct the choice of support programs offered for that year and are subject to change.

#### **Maths Target Teaching:**

Similar to the English Target Teaching programs, all Maths support and extension programs will begin in Week 5 of Term 1. Students are selected for the programs following detailed analysis of school based Maths data and assessments at the end of 2019 and at the start of this year. The programs provided in Semester 1 (Terms 1 and 2) are as follows:

- Modified Maths Program (Year 3—6)
- Target Teaching (Year 3—6)
- Maths Extension Program ( Year 3—6)

If your child has been selected, you will receive a letter, which you will need to sign to let us know that you have received notification. The letter will outline the purpose of each program and their structure, such as the number of sessions per week and the names of the teachers who will be working with the children in the program. Please note that these groups are constantly monitored and students may move in and out of these groups as needed, and parents will be informed of any changes.

#### LITERACY NEWS:

#### New Books

Term 1 is well underway and our home reading program is about to begin. Every year, our take-home reading library is updated with new books and this year is no exception. We have just spent \$2500 to update the books in the Prep—Two home reading boxes ready for a fresh start. Please talk to your children about handling the books with care so that we can get as much use out of them as possible.

In addition to purchasing new take-home readers, \$1700 has been spent on the purchase of MultiLit Decodable readers to complement our approach to the systematic teaching of phonics in the early years. Decodable readers are designed to incorporate the development of phonemic awareness, phonics, comprehension, vocabulary and fluency and when used in conjunction with rich literature, provide an excellent balance to any literacy program.

#### **Parent Helpers:**

Parents who have already done the training and have a volunteer card will be able to start from Monday 2nd March. Parents who have not previously done the training course will need to wait until their application is processed and they have been issued an STC Volunteer Card.
