

Dear Parents and Carers,

It has been great to have some more of our normal life return in the past few weeks. Being able to get to the Zoo (if you can get tickets), movies, catch up with loved ones and the return of junior sport have all been very welcome additions back into our lives. I hope you and your families have been able to enjoy the sunshine and the opportunities that have been opened up off the back of Victoria's terrific effort in suppressing COVID. This weekend my family were finally able to celebrate my daughter Zadie's baptism after it had to be cancelled in March, on the week of the first restrictions being implemented. It was really nice to be able to celebrate her with our family.

Transition Back to Onsite:

Once again our students are to be commended on the terrific way they have resumed onsite learning. We are finding minimal issues with students entering school independently now, even with our younger students. This has been a terrific side benefit of the restrictions that COVID has placed on us. The resilience and independence that has been developed across our student cohort has been wonderful to observe.

During the initial period of transition back to onsite learning, the school and I took a "honeymoon period" approach to managing and redirecting student behaviour, giving students a chance to settle in to routines and rules before strictly adhering to our Behaviour Management policy. This proved to be an effective strategy as it gave students the opportunity to own their behaviour, acknowledge that they had slipped up and then implement better choices going forward, without having to enforce some of the stricter consequences in the policy.

But as they say, all good things must come to an end! As the students have had a good amount of time to settle back in, we will be expecting them to more consistently make good choices in their behaviour and accordingly, we will be implementing our Behaviour Management policy firmly again. I ask you, as parents and co-educators of your children, to have a conversation with your children about good behaviour choices at school and giving their best effort to finish of 2020 is a positive way.

Grade 6 Transition sessions Moonee Valley Council and CRC Nth Keilor High School Q&A:

Our grade 6 students had a terrific opportunity to discuss their transition to high school and ask any questions that they may have about this milestone event. Both Moonee Valley Council and CRC North Keilor generously devoted their time to running sessions with our grade 6 classes where our students received valuable information regarding the big move up to high school and were able to ask the burning questions that they had directly to the source. Thank you to both CRC North Keilor and Moonee Valley Council for the opportunity.

Students' early Language Development Speaker Session:

Moonee Valley Council are also facilitating a Speech Pathologist talk to parents, focusing on early language development.

Listening, understanding and speaking skills are important for good literacy. Meet local speech pathologist, Naomi De Nicolo, who has over 20 years' experience in paediatrics. Enjoy a reading of one of Speech Pathology Australia's Book of the Year winning books and find out more about how you can support your child's language and literacy development at home.


Hats:
